## PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

### **Environmental Hazards**

This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates and may adversely affect non-target plants. To protect the environment, do not allow pesticide to enter or runoff into storm drains, drainage ditches, gutters or surface waters. Applying this product in calm weather when rain is not predicted for the next 24 hours will help to ensure that wind or rain does not blow or wash pesticide off the treatment area. Rinsing application equipment over the treated area will help avoid run off to water bodies or drainage systems.

This chemical has properties and characteristics associated with chemicals detected in groundwater. The use of this chemical in areas where soils are permeable, particularly where the water table is shallow, may result in groundwater contamination. ## **DIRECTIONS FOR USE**

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

### **1. Precautions And Restrictions**

- Do not apply this product in a way that will contact any person or pet, either directly or through drift. Keep people and pets out of the area during application. Do not allow people or pets to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.
- Do not exceed specified dosages for any area.
- Do not spray on carpetgrass, dichondra, nor on lawns or turf where desirable clovers are present. Clover present will be damaged if sprayed.

- Some injury can be expected to turf if used on St. Augustinegrass or centipedegrass; spot spray weeds on these grasses.
- Do not apply to newly seeded lawns until well established. New seed can be sown 3 to 4 weeks after application.
- Do not spray while grass is emerging from dormancy.
- Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.
- Do not apply as a fine mist because of potential for injury to desirable plants.
- Do not use this product on or near desirable plants, including contact of spray on exposed root systems or adventitious shoots within the drip line of desirable trees and shrubs, since injury may result.
- Do not apply directly to or near water, storm drains, gutters, sewers, or drainage ditches. Do not apply within 25 feet of rivers, fish ponds, lakes, streams, reservoirs, marshes, estuaries, bays, and oceans. Do not apply when windy. To prevent product run-off, do not over water the treated area(s) to the point of runoff or apply when raining or when rain is expected that day. Rinse applicator over lawn area only.
- After using this product, clean sprayer with soap or detergent and water.

### **2. Where To Use**

GroundWork® Concentrate Poison Ivy & Brush Killer may be used on bahiagrass, bermudagrass, bluegrass, fescue, perennial ryegrass or zoysia-grass lawns, vacant lots, playgrounds where broadleaf weeds are present. This product is especially effective on hard-to-kill weeds such as poison ivy, poison oak, sheep sorrel and spurge. In addition, it controls most other broadleaf weeds, including sensitive weeds like chickweed, clover, dandelion, knotweed, and plantain.

### 3. How Much To Use (Spot Treatment)

Apply a 2.3% to 4.6% (%vol/vol) spray solution as a full cover spray. Use the lower spray concentration in the range for susceptible species and use the higher spray concentration within the range for hard-to-control species, for mature plants during the late summer or under adverse environmental conditions (e.g. drought). Spray broadleaf weeds, woody plants or mixed brush uniformly and thoroughly by wetting all leaves, stems, bark and root collars.

**For Backpack sprayers, knapsack sprayers, and hand-pressurized pump sprayers.**

Instructions for preparing 1 to 3 gallons of spray solution at 2.3% to 4.6% spray concentration with water for high volume foliar applications.

#### Limitations on spot treatments to woody plants:

The maximum noncropland application rate for tree, brush and woody plant control is 2.2 gallons of product per acre per application per site. The maximum seasonal application rate for trees, brush and woody plant control is 2.2 gallons of product per acre per application per site. Limited to 1 application per year.

#### Limitations on spot treatments to residential turfgrass:

Spot treatment is defined as a treatment area no greater than 1,000 sq.ft. per acre. The maximum application rate is 3.0 fl.oz. per 1,000 sq.ft. per application. The maximum number of spot treatments is limited to 2 per year with a minimum of 30 days between applications.
