





- 1. Twist off the top half of the NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE unit.
- 2. Pry the edge of the seal with the toothpick (included) and remove it to expose the submerged wick in the bottom half (save the rubber seal if you want to).
- 3. Remove the upper wick (from the top half), stretch it out and then replace it.
- 4. Screw the top half back on, finger tight, and the wicks should connect. The oil will start wicking to the top of the unit and it should get slightly damp.
- 5. For an extra boost, turn the unit upside down for a couple minutes to saturate the whole wick. Then place, toss or roll the NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE<sup>TM</sup> device at desired location or mouse entry point.

  (Note: The mint aroma will be slightly stronger at the start of operation and will decrease after a day or so.)

Bingo! You are now ready to place the units! The best use is preventative, where you don't have mice yet or just began seeing mice (or their "evidence") and want to keep them out. In this case, place units (a) AS CLOSE AS YOU CAN to places they could enter (such as holes in walls, cabinets or floors, where pipes or electrical lines come through) and (b) in areas they are likely to frequent (or where there is evidence) – drawers, cabinets, behind appliances. You can toss or roll the **NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE**<sup>TM</sup> unit and it will stand upright by itself (if unobstructed) so you can get it where it needs to go, such as behind cabinets or appliances. Make sure it ends up mostly upright. See the other side for more detailed strategies you can use. You can also use the units in sheds, storage units, campers, cars, RV's, farm equipment, garages, boats, etc. It's most effective to cover all areas / entry points at the same time, so they don't have an easy path to go around.

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE<sup>™</sup> emits a scent that is pleasant to humans but offensive to the hypersensitive noses and eyes of wild mice. Their senses are hundreds of times more sensitive than ours, so when mice encounter the unit they find the vapor irritating and will avoid it. When they find an entry point to your house with a No Mouse in the House<sup>™</sup> unit, they retreat in the safest direction they know, which is back out the direction they came in. Once outside, they have a million other choices and will try going somewhere else. The units last about 6 months, depending somewhat on room temperature and airflow. (They can be effective longer as well, since mice learn to avoid them). Typically in the U.S., you place them in early fall and the units will last through the winter (when the mice have already found a home somewhere else). You can then place new units in early spring to repel the "baby boom" and last until the next fall.

#### **STRATEGIES**

(#1) PREVENTATIVE: The best strategy is preventative, placing units at all possible entry points to your house (or the area you need to protect) BEFORE you have mice. Look for all possible holes, gaps, cracks, places where pipes come through etc. Mice can squeeze through tiny holes, so when in doubt, block it. Often this is just prior to the cooling fall weather or just prior to the spring "baby boom". Mice are active all year, but these are the prime time seasons.

(#2) EXIT STRATEGY: If you already have mice, a different strategy is required. Established mice can have an established nest in your house or also, simply established a path from outside to food stores inside your house. With established mice you can discourage them by enclosing all your food securely and placing **NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE** units within or around these food storage areas (or the area you need to protect). For this strategy, you "lock up the store", but <u>leave exit points to the outside of your house open</u>, so if they are in your house, they have a path by which to leave. The strategy here is to protect the food supply so their hunger drives them elsewhere and out of your house permanently.

(#3) COMBINATION APPROACH: Established mice can be stubborn, reluctant to give up their nest and clever enough to find alternate pathways to your food once they know where it is. If they are really persistent, we recommend a combination approach. For this strategy, you protect your food stores (or the area you need to protect) by placing units within or around these areas. Also put units at all open entry points (in case they are coming in from outside) except leave one easy entry point open that they have already used. Then place a humane mouse trap (such as Havahart, sold elsewhere) at this location, baited with something sticky like peanut butter. The NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE units will disguise and protect your food stores, and discourage the use of all entry points but the one you've left open. You have basically left them with easy access to the tasty trap and everything else they find irritating. This strategy directs them right to the trap, making the trap that much more effective. If you have a lot of mice, use more than one trap to remove them quicker. Unfortunately, you still have to deal with emptying the trap far from your house. Do this until you have stopped trapping mice for a few days. Once the mice are removed, you can go back to using your NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE units to block all the entry points to keep out any newcomers (and not have to deal with this again).

#### CAUTION

DO NOT ALLOW PETS OR CHILDREN TO PLAY WITH THE UNIT (Place units where they can't be reached).

**PEPPERMINT OIL IS A NATURAL SOLVENT:** If the oil is allowed to leak out it can stain clothing, cabinets, furniture or floors. Vapors may also cause discoloration over time. Test the unit in an inconspicuous area the first time to determine if the vapors will damage or discolor the surface. **DO NOT place units near open flame or excessive heat.** 

DO NOT allow the units to deploy or be held sideways or upside-down once the rubber seal is removed (the peppermint oil will leak out of the unit).

BE SURE that the unit deploys upright or in a nearly upright position (within 45° of vertical): This will prevent oil in the unit from leaking out and provide the maximum product lifetime (The unit is bottom heavy and round, so it will right itself naturally if unobstructed).

#### FIRST AID

The oil inside the unit can cause minor skin, or eye irritation. In case of skin contact, wash thoroughly with soap and water. In case of eye contact, flush with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Consult a health care professional.

#### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Unopened NO MOUSE IN THE HOUSE<sup>TM</sup> units can be stored in any cool dry location and will stay effective for months, likely even for a year. Be sure to store the units out of the reach of children and pets. Optimal storage of an already opened and deployed unit requires carefully reversing the deployment steps outlined above. TO PREVENT CONTACT WITH THE OIL, USE RUBBER GLOVES. Unscrew the top half, carefully remove the Upper Wick and store in a sealed plastic bag (not included), replace the rubber seal and screw the top half back on. The top half will compress the rubber seal and the unit can now be safely stored.

DISPOSAL: The cardboard and paper packaging materials, wooden toothpick, and plastic parts (#5 Plastic) can typically be recycled in most communities. The cotton wicks can be composted or if you don't compost (and you should), discarded in the trash. The oil in the unit can cause minor skin irritations so use rubber kitchen gloves and the supplied toothpick to remove the wick. The rubber seal can also be recycled if silicone rubber is recyclable in your area.
